

STUDENTS IN RESIDENCE

The Students in Residence drawing shows the locations of student residences and both the occupancy and capacity of residences based on fall 2010 data. While there was a housing capacity at 1,984 beds, there were only 1,849 students living on campus, indicating a surplus of 135 beds.

Student residence halls are indicated in yellow and student houses are orange. The occupancy and capacity is shown graphically, each dot representing five student beds. The dark blue dots indicate bed occupancy, and light blue dots represent the number of additional beds not occupied that bring the total for each residence to the capacity number. The numbers for the student houses are shown in one block, as data for individual houses was not available.

Students at the College of Wooster are required to live on campus all four years of college enrollment except when they are studying abroad. In practice, a small number of students live at home or in rental units near the College. The vast majority of students live on campus at any one time.
