

## VEHICULAR CIRCULATION AND PARKING

Vehicular circulation is shown on this drawing. Through streets that carry cars from one part of the city to another are colored orange. Bever Street constitutes the western boundary of the campus and leads north to the major intersection with Quinby Avenue, Cleveland Road and Burbank Road at the northwest corner of this map. Beall Avenue runs north and south dividing the main campus in two. Palmer Street is a less travelled north-south through street and divides the golf course. The traffic on these through streets can be quite heavy; traffic lights that exist at the primary intersections are shown by a green and white dot. The primary point of conflict between pedestrians and vehicles for the College is in front of the Lowry Center on Beall Avenue; this is indicated by a turquoise and white dot. Neighborhood streets are yellow and alleys and/or roads with restricted access are indicated in pink.

Campus roads and parking lots are shown in red. Where directional flow of traffic is restricted, white arrows are shown. Parking lots have numbers indicating the number of parking spaces in that lot. There are currently a total of 1,537 parking spaces on campus, which represents 81 spaces per 100 students. There are 53 designated handicapped spaces in the total; the locations of these spaces are shown by a handicapped symbol. Service areas are indicated by a white S on a blue dot. Those walks that are shared by pedestrians and small service vehicles are shown in a red and white stripe, as on the Pedestrian Circulation drawing.
